Throughout my studies I was trying to figure out what is making my heart beat faster by experimenting with entirely different aesthethics and technics.


Now that I have just finished creating my graduate collection I can truly say that I have found myself and my passion.

EXPERIMENTAL FASHION PROJECT


EXPERIMENTAL SHIRT PROJECT

Have you ever looked at a photo of her and thought- what is she really thinking about?


























Your whole life under the plastic sheets.


